
An Early Reformer – Jan Hus





Jan Hus was a priest in Bohemia. He criticized the huge amount of wealth the church had collected and spoke out against the pope's authority. The true head of the church, he said, was Jesus Christ.

Hus wanted to purify the church and return it to the people. He called for an end to corruption among the clergy. He wanted both the Bible and the mass to be offered in the common language of the people instead of Latin.

In 1414, Hus was arrested and charged with heresy, speaking against the church. In July 1415, he was burned at the stake. Hus had a major influence on future reformers. Martin Luther would later say that he and his supporters were "all Hussites without knowing it."
